Re: Comments on Request for Reactivation of Hearing Process by Current Solutions Inc (“CSI”)

CSI is supportive of the reactivation of the DCAT hearing. CSI supports the approval of the DCAT project. With the limitations on transmission capacity in the Dawson Creek/Montney area, less efficient gas fired generation is being installed to meet the electrical demand, albeit with reduced reliability.

Further to the Board's request for comments on the reactivation of the DCAT hearing, CSI notes that BC Hydro has detailed its position in the reactivation filing. Whether the application interprets the existing tariff and regulations appropriately will require some review and consideration. CSI intends to submit IR's of the evidence submitted and provide written evidence in response to BC Hydro's DCAT application.

CSI is of the opinion that the balance of the hearing should include a round of IR's to address the new evidence from the both the BCUC and intervenors, followed by a written proceeding. CSI is of the opinion that an oral proceeding will be costly and not surface additional useful evidence. The technical nature of the material is better suited to a written process; consequently, CSI supports a written hearing. Regardless of the process selected by the BCUC, CSI will participate in the process.

CSI is supportive of a procedural conference and will attend on Monday April 16th to discuss the process going forward.
