Re: Insurance Corporation of British Columbia – 2017 Revenue Requirements Application – Project No. 1598929 – Intervener Information Request No. 1 Extension Request

Dear Mr. Quail and Mr. Landale:

On October 16, 2017, Allevato Quail & Worth, Barristers and Solicitors, representing the Movement of United Professionals (MoveUP), filed a two-day extension request to the intervener information request (IR) No. 1 deadline of November 6, 2017, pursuant to the Regulatory Timetable established by Order G-156-17 dated October 10, 2017. MoveUP submits that it did not receive Order G-156-17 until the date of its letter and, due to the Commission's determinations regarding the Independent Review Report prepared by Ernst & Young LLP it requires more time to address the report's issues. On October 17, 2017, Mr. Landale filed a letter in support of MoveUP's request for an extension.

The Panel considered the extension request and is not persuaded that any modifications to the Regulatory Timetable are warranted. MoveUP and Mr. Landale were both granted intervener status on October 11, 2017. The Panel views that the current intervener IR No. 1 deadline provides ample time to prepare interrogatories from the time intervener status was granted to November 6, 2017.

With respect to the receipt of Order G-156-17, the Panel notes that this Order was issued and posted on the evidentiary record prior to MoveUP and Mr. Landale being granted intervener status. Thus, the parties were not on the Commission's electronic mailing list at the time of the Order's issuance. At Mr. Landale's request on October 16, 2017, the Commission sent Order G-156-17 to Mr. Landale and included MoveUP. The Panel expects parties, once granted intervener status, to participate actively in a proceeding which would include remaining informed about deadlines and evidence submitted by other parties by checking the proceeding's record.

By this letter, the Panel confirms the Regulatory Timetable as established by Order G-156-17.
