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INFORMATION RELEASE – BCUC Creates Webpage for Site C Filings

VANCOUVER – Today, the British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC) launched a webpage specifically designated to host all regulatory filings related to BC Hydro’s Site C hydroelectric dam (Site C). This webpage is in response to public requests for more access to information about Site C, in particularly BC Hydro’s Quarterly Progress Reports.

The webpage will include links to informational, compliance and other documents such as BC Hydro’s Quarterly Site C Progress Reports and BCUC-requested biweekly reports on Site C COVID-19 Impact and Risk Mitigation. The webpage will also include Commission compliance documents including BCUC staff questions, BC Hydro’s responses, and letters of comment we have received from the public related to Site C. Documents will be regularly added to the webpage as additional information is received or issued by the BCUC.

This is an important project for the BCUC, as we are committed to enhancing transparency around our work, which includes our correspondence with BC Hydro regarding Site C.

Site C Inquiry

The BCUC completed an inquiry examining the impact on BC Hydro ratepayers associated with continuing, suspending or terminating the Site C project in 2017. Since the completion of the BCUC’s Inquiry, the BC government [committed to completing](#) the construction of Site C. The BCUC receives voluntary Quarterly Progress Reports on the Project, and requests ad-hoc information from BC Hydro through staff questions and compliance filing requests, as necessary.
