RE: Insurance Corporation of British Columbia 2012 Revenue Requirement Application Project Number 3698654

I write in response to your letter dated May 15, 2012 in which two options amending the existing Revised Regulatory Time Table were proposed.

The Automobile Insurance Committee of the Canadian Bar Association (AIC) is of the view that the oral public hearing should proceed although the AIC is agreeable to the oral argument process being replaced with written arguments.

The oral hearing process is important. It is a fundamental principle that not only should justice is done, but that justice is seen to be done. Foreclosing the ability of the interveners and the Panel to question ICBC in an open and public forum would, in our view, entirely remove the ability of the parties to test the credibility of the underlying assertions which form the basis for ICBC's application.

The AIC also asks the panel to reconsider its decision denying the admission of the expert report prepared by Mr. Edward Mansfield of MNP. I attach a copy of Mr. Mansfield's c.v. for the Panel's review.

One of the grounds that formed the basis for the decision was that the admission of the report would "unfavourably affect the efficient and timely review of the Application." While the AIC recognizes that there must always be a balance between fairness and efficiency, the former should never be lost for the sake of the latter.

ICBC claims that the introduction of an expert opinion now would be prejudicial to it in that they would not have a "fair opportunity to ask IR's" before the hearing and prepare for the hearing. Mr. Mansfield's report will deal with ICBC's forecasting models that relate to the bodily injury loss cost forecast variance and trend. His opinion is based upon the information provided by ICBC and it is unlikely that there is anything in the report that would generate an IR.

Not allowing the AIC to admit this expert evidence would seriously undermine its ability to put forward its case and would, in our view, be a breach of procedural fairness. ICBC's concern about prejudice could be alleviated by allowing a short delay in the hearing - if necessary.

The AIC also notes that the suggested options outlined in your recent letter will extend the timetable to June 21, 2012, approximately 9 days after the currently scheduled conclusion date of June 12, 2012.

To reiterate, the AIC is of the view that an oral hearing remains the best process to test ICBC's reasons for requesting a very significant increase in basic insurance rates. We also respectfully request that the Panel reconsider its earlier decision and allow the AIC to admit Mr. Mansfield's report into evidence.
