Hi Bob,

I'm just back from a long absence and am catching up with emails on my home computer.

Just to let you know that we sent in our acceptance of smart meters and have received a response from BC Hydro acknowledging that acceptance and notifying us that a contractor will show up and install it some time in the near future. However, we are not opposed to revising this option and reading our own meters, as you suggest, if BC Hydro considers your proposal. This is what we did for 16 years while living in Calgary by filling out a prepaid post card and dropping it in the mail - too simple. I'd be happy to take a picture of the meter or fill out a postcard and send it to them. I'd be happy letting a local JL person read my meter in case we're not home and send it in if Hydro wants a collective action to reduce their chaos and insure all meters get read. We're OK with any suggestions in this vain.

We've had conversations re smart meters and I think you know we're basically indifferent about them - we don't feel strongly one way or another. I understand there are those in the community who feel strongly and I'm not unsympathetic to some of the arguments but I don't want to pay more for the no meter option.
