The CEC will examine the planning environment and assess the appropriateness of the Resource Planning objectives, the reasonableness of the load forecast and various load scenarios, the appropriateness of the assessment of existing supply side resource options, the validity of the assessment of the Distribution and Transmission system, the validity of the load resource balance, the cost-effectiveness of existing and prospective resource options including DSM, and the appropriateness of the proposed resource mix portfolio and the methodology for determining this, along with the alternatives. The CEC will examine the appropriateness of the determination of the Long Run Marginal cost, the adequacy of First Nations and other stakeholder consultation along with other issues that may arise.
