BCSEA supports the province's transition to a lower-carbon economy. BCSEA has five chapters across B.C. and approximately five hundred individual and corporate members. Many of BCSEA's members are ratepayers of FortisBC. BCSEA represents individuals and corporations in BC who care about energy sustainability and climate change, and who want the energy they purchase and use to be sustainably produced and transmitted.

SCBC is a non-profit organization of British Columbians from all walks of life. SCBC represents individuals in BC who care about a broad range of environmental issues, including climate change and clean energy, and who want the energy they purchase and use to be produced and transported in ways that minimize harm to the natural environment. SCBC has five local groups and over 12,000 members and supporters across the province. Many of SCBC's members are ratepayers of FortisBC.

- FortisBC's application regarding 2012-2013 Revenue Requirements, 2012-2013 Capital Expenditure and DSM Plan, and 2012 Integrated System Plan,
- FortisBC's 2011 DSM Plan and 2011 Capital Expenditure Plan,
- FortisBC's 2011 Residential Inclining Block (RIB) Rate application,
- FortisBC's 2009 Net Metering Tariff Application,
- FortisBC's 2012 Advanced Metering Infrastructure CPCN application,
- Pacific Northern Gas's 2014 application regarding a resubmitted DSM Plan,
- Pacific Northern Gas's 2015 DSM Application, and
- BC Hydro's 2016 application for acceptance of a DSM expenditure schedule for F2017-F2019 (ongoing).

BCSEA and SCBC serve on FortisBC's Resource Planning Advisory Group. BCSEA and SCBC also serve on BC Hydro's stakeholder advisory group regarding DSM and on BC Hydro's Technical Advisory Committee regarding the Integrated Resource Plan. In addition, BCSEA and SCBC serve on the Utilities' Conservation Potential Review Technical Advisory Committee.

- Long term load forecast of energy and capacity needs,
- Load scenarios,
- Transmission and distribution system,
- Load-Resource balance,
- Resource options,
- DSM options,
- Supply-side resource options,
- Portfolio analysis and long run marginal cost,
- DSM legal and policy framework,
- DSM plan development, principles, steps, Conservation Potential Review, benefit cost analysis,
- DSM scenario development,
- DSM programs,
- DSM and low-carbon electrification, low-carbon fuel switching

- Self-generators eligibility for DSM,
- Rate Schedule 90, and
- other issues to be determined.
