Western LNG LLC (Western) requests status as an intervener in this proceeding. Western opposes, on public interest grounds, the Letter Agreement entered into between Pacific Northern Gas Ltd. (PNG) and Triton LNG Limited Partnership (Triton) for the reasons outlined in Western's letter dated June 8, 2018 (Exhibit E-1-1).

Please state how you are directly or sufficiently affected by the Commission's decision in this matter; or describe your experience, information, or expertise relevant to this matter that would contribute to the Commission's decision making.*

Western has been in discussions with PNG since October 2017 to make arrangements to use substantially all of the existing capacity on PNG's public utility pipeline system between Summit Lake and Kitimat for the purpose of delivering gas to Western's proposed liquefaction facilities on Douglas Channel. As such, Western has material and significant interest in the allocation of PNG's excess capacity. Western's participation in this proceeding will help in providing the Commission with all material facts related to the Letter Agreement in order for it to make a just and fair determination.

Please list the key issues you intend to address in the proceeding.*

Western intends to provide further detailed evidence on the material facts outlined in its letter dated June 8 (Exhibit E-1-1) and to provide detailed arguments about the regulatory principals that should guide the Commission's decision, including the necessity of transparency and even-handedness when public utilities, such as PNG, are dealing with affiliates, such as Triton. In particular, Western intends to address the arguments that i) PNG should not be permitted to appropriate low cost existing capacity on its pipeline for the exclusive use of its affiliate; ii) PNG should not be permitted to enter into an option agreement dedicating capacity on its system on terms (volume, total option fee, length of option, extension fees) that are less favourable to PNG than comparable option agreements have been offered and approved by the Commission in the past; iii) PNG should not be permitted to enter into an option agreement dedicating capacity on its system on terms that are less favourable to PNG than those currently on offer from a competing shipper; iv) PNG should not be permitted to grant an option over its system that would preclude the use of excess capacity by other would-be shippers of which PNG is aware in favour of a project that is as lacking in definition or substance as that proposed by Triton; and v) PNG should not be permitted to grant a preference to one would-be shipper over another in circumstances where both shippers are contemporaneously seeking service; and vi) PNG should not be permitted to obtain approval of an agreement without disclosing all material facts related to that agreement.
