The City of Surrey ("Surrey") currently owns and operates a district energy utility that is wholly owned by Surrey and entirely within the boundaries of Surrey. The district energy utility is located in the City Centre area and Surrey has plans to expand it to one of the largest in the province. Surrey is interested in understanding the parameters of regulating such utilities and in proceedings that may directly affect Surrey's management of its utility. Surrey is interested in taking

part in the inquiry to ensure that any regulation is workable and in the best interests of Surrey's residents and businesses.
