Re: Corix Multi-Utility Services Inc. – Burnaby Mountain District Energy Utility 2020-2023 Revenue Requirement and Rates Application – Project No. 1599123 – Workshop

Dear Mr. South:

On July 30, 2020, Corix Multi-Utility Services Inc. (Corix) submitted an application seeking British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC) approval of its Burnaby Mountain District Energy Utility (BMDEU) revenue requirements and rates from 2020 through to 2023, effective September 1, 2020 (Application). By Order G-220-20 dated August 19, 2020, among other things, the BCUC established a written hearing process and regulatory timetable to review the Application. In accordance with the regulatory timetable, a Corix-led virtual workshop will be held on Tuesday, October 13, 2020. Corix states it plans to present a summary of the key topics in the Application at the workshop.

The Panel considers it would be of value to the BCUC and participants of the proceeding for Corix to address the following topics at the workshop:

- Overview of the buildout schedule and forecast biomass demand, including any updates or changes since the 2017 Corix Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the BMDEU;
- Overview of the cost allocation and methodology between SFU and UniverCity;
- Overview of the status of the Central Energy Plant, including an update on delivery parameters and schedule of any planned performance testing, and considering the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic;
- Overview of the proposed rates and rate structure for SFU and UniverCity customers;
- Rate Design principles behind the proposed change in rate structure for UniverCity;
- Rationale and specifics about the Energy Cost Reconciliation Account for UniverCity; and
- The current status of the Revenue Deficiency Deferral Account (RDDA), and the planned deferral and treatment of any balance in the RDDA during the 2020-2023 test period.

As the workshop will be hosted by Corix, the BCUC defers to Corix to provide further information to potential workshop participants regarding registration and instructions on how to participate. The Panel confirms they will

be in attendance and the workshop will be transcribed for the evidentiary record and audio broadcasted through Allwest Reporting.
