Comment:

We have owned our property at Cosens Bay since 1987. Over the years we have gone from hauling batteries and propane tanks to service our travel trailer to where we now have a small house that we can run by generator. Although this is a big improvement, hauling the heavy gas containers is not as easy as it was when we were 30+ years younger. We are also reticent to operate the generator as it is noisy and I worry about the impact to the environment. Having power is not only an environmentally friendly solution but it will also allow us to safely enjoy our property in our retirement years. Here are just a few examples of the impact power would have not only on our lives but on the environment and air quality. Something as important as the operation of a CPAP machine is currently not possible without running a noisy generator overnight. We use a noisy two cycle pump to get our water from the lake. This means hauling heavy gasoline containers down to the shore. Power would mean we could purchase an electric pump system. Electricity is something the majority of Canadians take for granted and we hope that our application for what many would see as a basic commodity will be supported by the Commission.
