ORDER

WHEREAS:

- A. On September 11, 2020, CB Powerline Ltd. (CBP) filed an application to the British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC) for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) for the Cosens Bay community electrification project (Project) pursuant to sections 45 and 46 of the *Utilities Commission Act* (Application);
- B. In seeking a CPCN for the Project, CBP requests approval to build, own, operate and maintain an electrical distribution system servicing the community of Cosens Bay on Kalamalka Lake, Regional District of North Okanagan, B.C.;
- C. By Order G-248-20 dated October 5, 2020, the BCUC established a written public hearing process and a regulatory timetable for the proceeding;
- D. By Order G-317-20 dated December 4, 2020, the BCUC amended the regulatory timetable and directed CBP to provide further notice to affected parties. The amended regulatory timetable established the date for intervener registration as January 7, 2021;
- E. On December 10, 2020, CBP filed its responses to BCUC Information Requests (IR);
- F. By January 7, 2021, no intervener registration requests were received by the BCUC; and
- G. The BCUC has reviewed the IR responses and determines that a further regulatory timetable is warranted.

NOW THEREFORE the BCUC orders that a further regulatory timetable for the review of the Application is established, as set out in Appendix A to this order.
