Hello BCUC-Site C inquiry. August 30,2017

Basically BCHydro demand has been flat for 10 years ,at about 53 GWH.Recently it was stated that demand ,in BC,will be 40 percent over 20 years alone based on population growth alone and not factoring in improved technological efficiencies.With the recent annual report out for BCHydro ,only about 1/3 of a GWh was added to annual demand which is about 2/3 below 2 percent claimed annually so over 20 years maybe 13-15 percent overall demand.

Considering BC fires ,of recent years, use of Burrard Thermal emission would be negligible but the last BC ruling party demands only certain energy used,Burrard Thermal is set to be shut down and turned into condos?.

Columbia river treaty fine tuning would help with power access as well as IPP contracts are being overpaid annually by 800 million dollars a year over open market rates.BCHydro has to buy iIPP power as primary supplier even over own dams.BCHydro pays Woodbridge 1.6 million a year for IPP contract but could easliy save a million a year by buying on open market wholesale surplus energy market?.

Like golden ears bridge and Port Mann bridge many of BC mega projects are coming in over budget and underperforming.More like manufactured consent under pressure by external interests perhaps.? Looking eastward projects such as Keeyask ,in Manitoba and Muskrat falls in Labrador/NFLD way over budget in the billions of dollars.

When former BCHydro executive and former BC premir and the UN and first nations say to stop that does carry some gravitas.
